She has been working as Assistant Professor and the Chair of the Department of Architecture at Istanbul Kemerburgaz University. She has been teaching basic design and architectural design studios. Her research interests lie in the fields of theory and research in architecture, architectural design, architectural education, architecture-phenomenology relationality, learning space design, scholarship of teaching and learning in higher education. Brief Explanation (aims and expected outcome) (max100 words)	<p>Parasitism, as a biological term, indicates to “an ecological relationship between two organisms”- one the host and the other the parasite (Myburg, 2014, 19). “Intruding” and “inhabiting” are the two foremost ways of existence for parasitic organisms wherein the parasite benefits from the host (Adhienides, 2005, 16). In a similar way, “parasitic architecture” refers to a design strategy based on an alternative way of place-making in urban environments. Architectural parasites are structures that are attached to an existing building, elements of urban infrastructures or urban voids in a way to benefit from the manifold aspects of the host structure. Structurally, they are adaptable, flexible and sustainable. They bring forth a new program, diverse functional possibilities and patterns of experience to existing urban environments. The “Parasitic Hub” workshop aims to foster a re-appropriation of existing or unused spaces in the EMU Campus through the</p>

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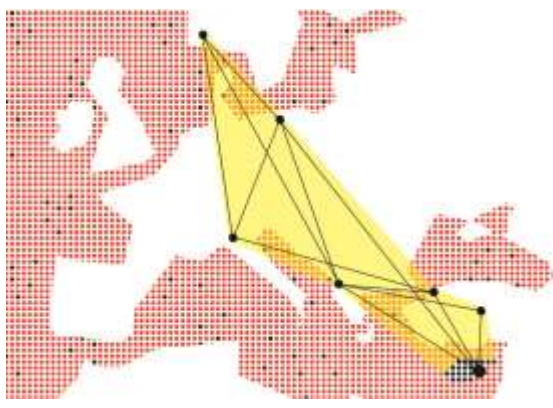
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	<p>design of architectural parasites. The participants of the workshop will explore alternative ways for critical and creative re-use of space while designing and constructing 'hubs' for the dwellers of the EMU Campus.</p> <p>PARAZİTİK HUB</p> <p>Parazitizm, biyolojik bir söylem olarak "iki organizma arasındaki ekolojik bir ilişki" olarak açıklanır. Bu ilişkideki organizmaların biri ev sahibi, diğeri ise parazittir (Myburg, 2014, 19). "Zorla girmek" ve "yerleşmek" parazitin ev sahibinden yararlanarak varoluşunu gerçekleştirmesi için en önde gelen davranışlardır (Adhienides, 2005, 16). Benzer şekilde "parazitik mimari", kentsel çevrede alternatif mekan-yaratma yöntemini temel alan bir tasarım stratejisini ifade eder. Mimari parazitler mevcut bir yapıya, kentsel altyapı unsurlarına veya kentsel boşluklara bağlı olan ve ev sahibi yapının çeşitli yönlerinden faydalanan oluşumlardır. Yapısal olarak uyarlanabilir, esnek ve sürdürülebilirlerdir. Mevcut kentsel çevrelere yeni bir program, çeşitli işlevsel olanaklar ve deneyim örüntüleri getirirler.</p> <p>"Parazit Hub" atölyesi, DAÜ Kampüsü'nde var olan veya kullanılmayan mekanların mimari parazitler tasarlayarak dönüştürülmesini amaçlıyor. Atölye katılımcıları, bir yandan mekanın eleştirel bakış açısı ve yaratıcılık ile yeniden kullanımına yönelik alternatif yaklaşımları irdeleyecekler, diğeryandan da, DAÜ Kampüs sakinleri için 'hub'lar tasarlayacaklardır.</p>
